



ASWU Meeting Minutes 10/5/2016

Meeting was brought to order at 5:01pm in the AWSU Assembly Chambers

Mission Statement read by Mike

1. Guest Speaker - Office of Church Engagement

Kathryn Hendrix - First off we offer a summer fellowship program every year. Applications are open now. If you know of any students who are interested, please let them know they can start filling out those applications now. This is a 10-12 week summer ministry program. Students should apply if ministry is something they might explore after college. It includes a \$3,000 stipend to cover costs. Those participating would be mentored all summer long. The purpose of this fellowship should not be viewed like a traditional internship. Last year, Luke worked in Alaska. He did a lot of fishing and hiking and worked a lot with high school students. It was great. If anybody is interested, please contact herself or Terri.

Terri Mccongial- The first 2 years of this program, we sent out 92 students. Total the amount of money that has assisted students this far has reached over \$300,000. They had students all over the country the last few years, and many international. There was one student who was working in a chocolate bar in downtown Seattle for example. The office is sending 6 students internationally this coming summer. They are working on a grant to send a total of 90 students international in the years 2018-2020. The office currently has about 75 different possibilities of different sites or locations to attend.

Kathryn Hendrix - They are bringing multiple people over the next 9 months from other countries to share their experiences. Musa, came last week from Kenya. 8 more speakers throughout the year will be joining us. She will be passing out a flyer with the dates and info.

Terri Mccongial - We don't even know the names of most of the people coming from these other countries, because they would become in danger if it was on the internet. Another thing the office is putting together is the Gospel Conference which falls on the weekend of Fall Break. This conference will take place for the next 3 years. This year the theme is Gospel and Racism. Of course racism plays out in a variety of ways. National leaders will join us here on campus to share their perspective. The conference will start Thursday, October 27th in the Hub. We will sit around and share. The conference goes all day Friday, and Saturday. The conference will feature several speakers and guests who are advocates around the nation. The Gospel Conference will give students and community members the resources to educate themselves on a topic which is very important in today's society. The conference will then move downtown to the Holy Temple Church of God in Christ in downtown Spokane. They would love to have students involved. If anyone wants to volunteer for the conference, please reach out to him. The Gospel Conference will be held October 27th-29th. It will cost \$10 for the admission.

2. Club Updates

a. Gospel Choir

Kyla - The Gospel Choir has been rehearsing for about 3 weeks. They currently have about 12 members. First performance will take place on October 23rd at a local church. They will be performing at 9am.

Jeff - If people want to join, is it too late?

Kyla - No, if people want to join, the choir has rehearsal every Saturday 11am-12:30pm in the chapel.

b. Off the Page

Hannah - Off the Page has been around for a couple years. They are looking into doing the lines over pine event again this year. Also they are planning an open mic, poetry slam night. Off the Page is looking to do other events throughout the year. We are inviting writers and speakers to attend these events. The club and events provide a way for students to explore themes of writing as an art form. The club will accept members all the time. Please contact her with any questions or interest in joining.

3. Homecoming Updates

Rachel - Homecoming is this weekend! I have got everything pretty much figured out at this point. I need people to help with Security at the dance. The job would be to walk around and look for weird things happening at the dance. If there were any issues, you would report those to the campus security person in attendance.

Camina - Are you aloud to dance and have fun while working as security?

Rachel and Dayna - Yes, just keep an eye out for things happening.

Rachel - Also a huge thank you to everyone who came this last weekend to help on decorations. We created a ton of golden pinecones, and if anybody has creative ideas to hang these pine cones at the dance, I will gladly accept those ideas. The banners look really good, great job everyone. 4. Financial Vice President

Jeff - You should have all got my email on this last week's requisitions. We will need to take a vote on my requisition for the proposed transfer of \$3,000 from Capital to Unallocated. To make sure everyone is aware of the difference; Capital is for long term projects (lasting for more than 5 years), and Unallocated is for short term projects (events, treats, etc.) The situation at hand is we now is we have \$18,700 in Capital, and \$1,494 in Unallocated. The goal with this transfer is to make these funds accessible to students. A quick note, the Capital account has a reserved \$5,000 for emergency, so knowing this that leaves \$13,700 currently in Capital. Most of the funds that we see requisitions for, come from the Unallocated account. Any questions for me?

Norma - Was there a specific reason for the amount of \$3,000 to be chosen?

Jeff - I just thought that would be a safe number to transfer based off of last year's numbers.

Christina - How much did we spend in unallocated last year?

Jeff - I am not sure on the exact number.

Breanna - I believe it was around \$2,000-\$3,000.

Jeff - That sounds about right.

Breanna - Is there any limit on the amount of money we can transfer?

Jeff - No, but if we request a transfer over \$5,000, we must collect a student body vote.

Alex M. - How is the budget determined for each account?

Jeff - It really depends on the student enrollment numbers. Every student pays an ASWU fee, and it just depends how many students we have that determines the amount of money we have access to.

Norma - Hypothetically, what would happen if we don't pass the transfer?

Jeff - It would limit the amount of money that the finance committee is able to grant for requisitions. For example, we had a requisition this last week from the theme houses to put on a Halloween Block Party. They requisitioned for a total of \$500. If the committee granted that amount, without the transfer, the Unallocated account would be under \$1,000 which would limit ASWU and our abilities.

Christina - Is it (Unallocated account) so low because of the addition of representative hours?

Jeff - Yes

Breanna - We will now ask Jeff to step out. Any time a requisition is made, the person who filled it must step out while the vote takes place.

Norma - Any more discussion before we vote?

Christina - Is there any need not to pass this?

General consensus was no there is no reason not to pass this transfer.

Mae - Did this go to finance committee first or straight to here?

Breanna - It went to the finance committee first, which they recommended that we pass. It takes an assembly majority vote to pass any transfer.

Breanna - Any other questions? Motions?

Jordan motions for the transfer of \$3,000 from Capital to Unallocated, 2nd by Mae, approval unanimous.

5. Executive Vice President

Norma - Just 2 short announcements. Congratulations to all the representatives on your positions. We collected a total 662 votes in the General Election, which had a lot better participation than the Primaries. We also didn't have any technical issues during the General Election. That is very exciting. The SEC (Student Election Committee) and I dealt with a grievance over the weekend, but it has been taken care of. Thank you to all the SEC Members for your help.

6. President

Breanna - ASWU Survey Results have been tallied and I have compiled all of the data in charts for you guys. This is a really good way for us to accountable and create conversations around these results.

Breanna - Senators this is something you could advertise. Questions or thoughts on results?

Bailey - The survey results showed a big interest for concerts. Just for everyone's information, most of the time repeat concerts do not work out. This is because when the artists come the first time they are not very popular, but when we want them to come back they are a lot more expensive because they are now more famous.

Jordan - Have you thought about getting a big name and having people pay for tickets?

Bailey - If we wanted someone big name, for example I worked out some numbers before and we would have to make them pay about \$50 per person with 500 students, even with my funds subsidizing it. Bowling for soup is the highest survey result right now for who students want to see.

Mae - How many people have responded?

Bailey - Over 500 students have voted.

Breanna - Also another thing, ASWU is the first to take over the new Whitworth University Snapchat Account. We are going to post a video of the meeting, let's come up with a great idea?

Whitney - Shout out to Bre for getting the survey results tallied.

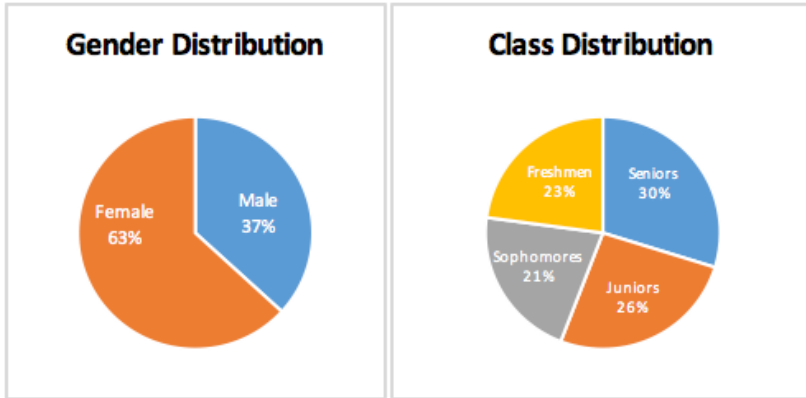
Christina - Shout to Norma for all of her work for the elections and dealing with grievances.

Conducted on 9/14/16

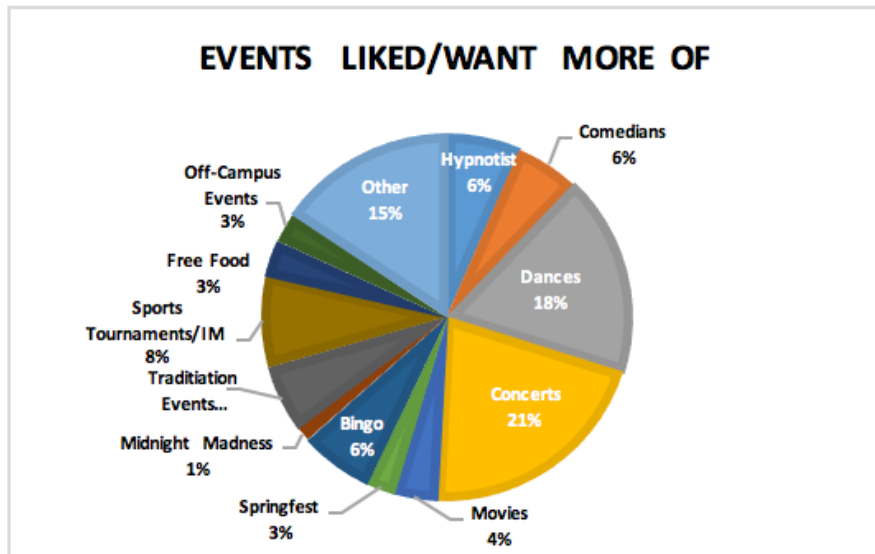
Demographics

Question 1: One of the primary functions of ASWU is to put on events such as dances, comedians, concerts, speakers, trivia, intramurals, tournaments. Etc.

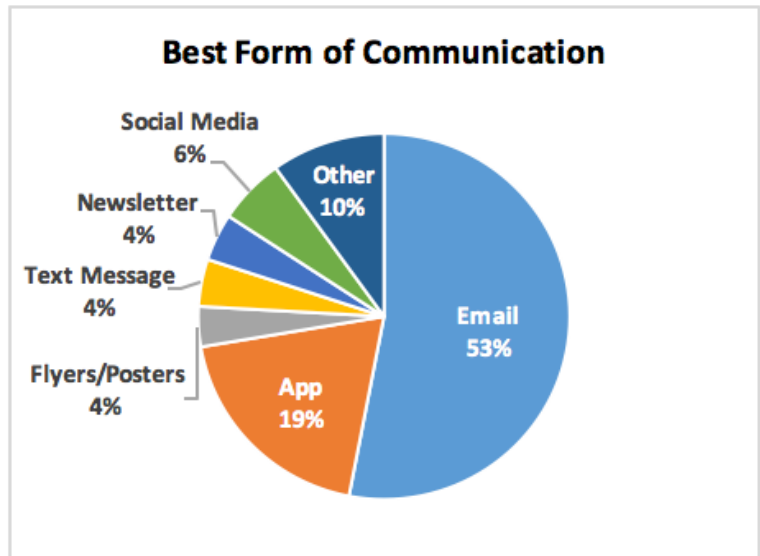
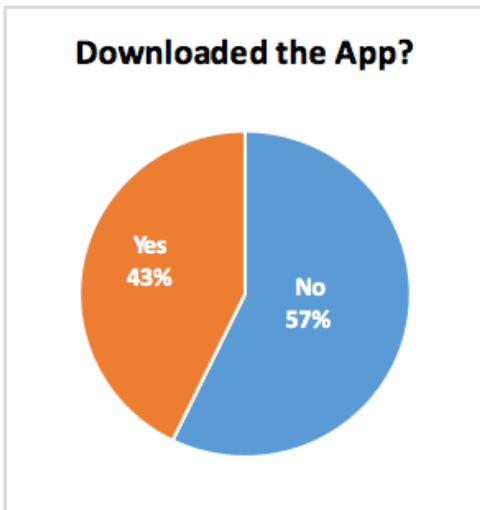
- a. What events are you looking forward to or have like this year, and what ones do you want to see?



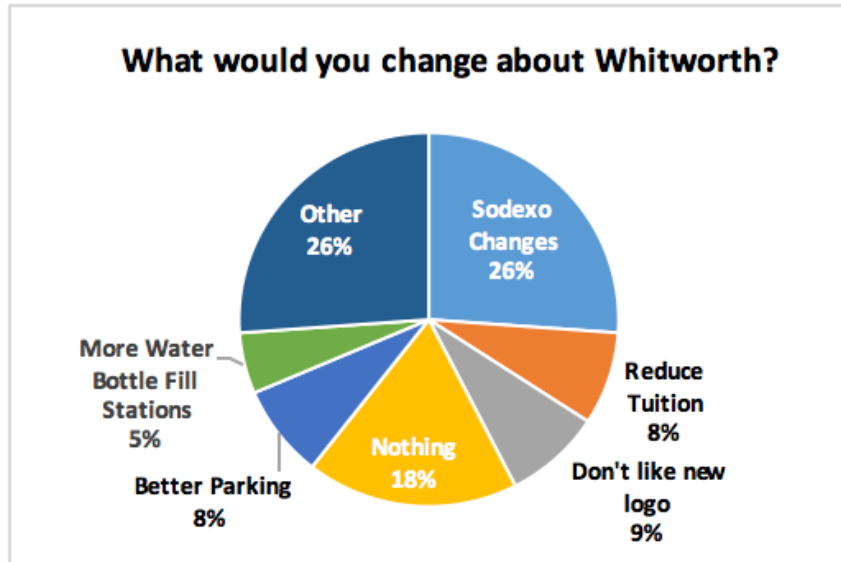

Question 2: What is the best way for ASWU to communicate with you? Have you downloaded the ASWU App?

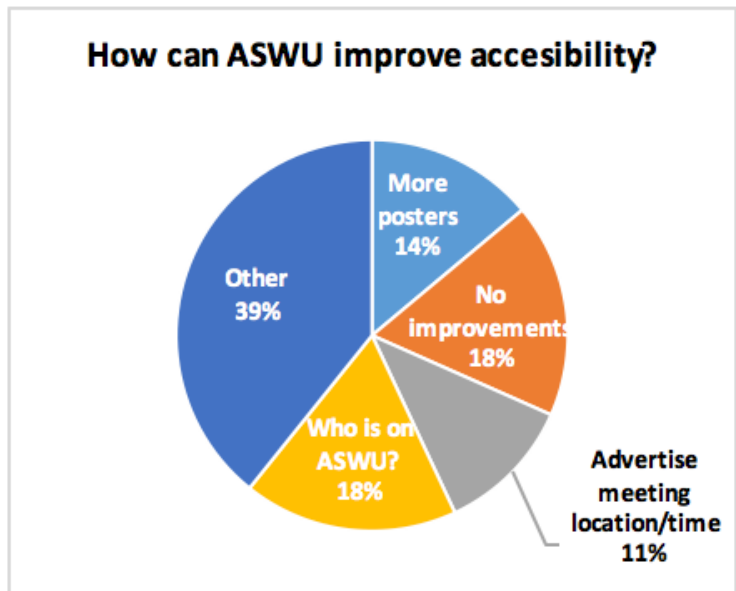
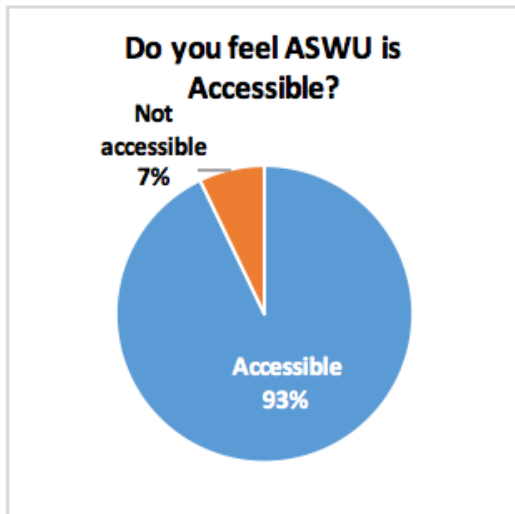


Question 3: If you had the opportunity to change an aspect of Whitworth, what would it be? How could ASWU participate in that process?
