BobbiJo: And then I have a Bylaw change as well, so that voting goes smoother. So, this is a different bylaw change than the one after the constitution change gets approved. So in section 9 of the bylaws, it on part 3 of section 9 it says to get majority vote of the entire student body or two thirds of the student body. But that doesn't happen, we never get the entire student body to vote so I want to change the bylaws to say of the students casting ballot. So it will be two thirds of the students who vote. Does anyone have any question about that?

Niraj: I see like in the future that kinda cause like people who happened to be in the hub might be the people to cast their vote I don't know.

BobbiJo: So the problem is that nothing would get passed so we are gonna do all this work for constitution change and then won't get passed because not everyone votes and the people who do come into the hub half the time its aswu voting people. I understand and its something I took into account, but its really hard to get hold of 2500 students at whitworth, so we just wanna make it easier to make a change.
