My name is Shari Clarke, and I am here on an interim basis as the interim director of student diversity equity and inclusion and any of you who had the opportunity to meet with me I know it was just a huge pleasure. I recently retired from Eastern Washington university where I was the inaugural vice president for diversity officer for the past seven years and prior to that I was vice president for diversity at Marshall University. Any of you know a little tidbit about Marshall University? Marshall in Huntington WV? Movie? Football? We are Marshall, major movie? well it has the unfortunate history of being the only institution where the entire football team was killed playing a football game and they made the major movie titled we are Marshall. But the university has bounced back from that and they're doing fantastic but it's really a big history there and it's a fantastic place to be and this happened in the 70s. anyway aside from that I just wanted to share with you very briefly about the office. we do the bucks bridge program which I'm sure many of you are familiar with, the multicultural leadership program and we support our international students through advocacy of support mentoring all the programs you do for pre-orientation, orientation and to make sure we have like you stated an authentic multicultural inclusive environment that is a microcosm of society that's our goal. but I'm here to share you take just a couple of new programs that we have and I want you all to be aware of them. I am concerned that I don't often see um great deal of the numbers of bipoc students in the intercultural student center and if you notice it's intercultural because it's for all of us all of us should be there all of us should be using it all of us should be hanging out there and I'm worried that I don't see those students kind of coming into those spaces and perhaps those students are somewhere else and they're having a lot more fun and if that's the case I'm all for it I'm 100% behind it. but I do want to see more students use utilizing that space and with that being said we're kind of trying to broaden some of the programs that we're doing. On October 23rd we're entering into a collaboration with campus ministries entitled "Awake" and the thing for that is finding God in unexpected places. You all will get Flyers and information about that for October 23rd from 9:15 to 10:00 PM but we're asking students to come in and kind of share their faith and their testimonies around that thing. On October 17th we're hosting Donuts and dialogue with the DEI director and special guest and that was the brain child when I've spent some time with Sophie and we talked about other ways to get more diverse populations into that space. so there's more than Donuts we will have beverages with those Donuts but we wanna encourage once again more diverse populations to come to that space and the special guest that the BSU president selected is Betsy Wilkerson. many of you know who Betsy Wilkerson is. there's my second tidbit. OK, Betsy Wilkerson has 2 unique components to her first and foremost she's the first woman to be president of the Spokane City Council and she also was the first woman to be an African American. So two historical facts about Betsy Wilkerson, she will be our special guest on October 17th so come out and have Donuts with us and more than Donuts and dialogue with her. It will be a lot of fun, she's a fantastic speaker. Also on November 8th we have first gen day. And on Saturday November 9th we're having a belonging retreat so I'm so excited because you could come out have prizes food fun. we want folks to get together particularly our entering students, freshman students, so they're having a good time with each other everybody's networking and we're all connecting with each other, so a little more information on that and another ticket
