Club Charter

Gender Equality Movement:

Katie: In the FSOPs for first year as a club you have \$300 but depending on activities and events that they put on throughout the year.

Faizzan: the way it works is we have a budget committee at the end of the year that determine budgets and so depending on what they do during the year that could change.

Cycling Club:

President Updates

Parker: Last Wednesday met with University council. They mentioned tuition rose by 2.9% and they are trying to decrease it. COVID cares wants 5% surveillance per week and have kept COVID cases low. Flex system has worked well with faculty and everyone needs to keep doing their part. Just a heads up still waiting on Inslee's' new mandate and how that will affect us. Because of refunds from spring, reserves went from 3.5 million to \$200,00 want that replenished by 2024. Over 200 students fully online right now, also with budget cuts in that has resulted in \$6 million in savings.

Jed: In tuition at 2.9% do you know how much that is in raw dollars?

Parker: No, I do not they just gave me that percent.
