President Updates

Be sure to take NSSE survey, they still need more answers, and now to Christian for the outreach coordinator position.

Christian: today we will be voting on the outreach coordinator proposal

Georgia moves to approve, Xavier second

Jaedon: Did anything change with the budget when that went through committee?

Faizzan: it has not happened yet until end of April

Jed: I have been working with Christian to tweak the position. I love the idea and I think with low income and especially disability is way underrepresented but I wanted to try and focus this position on just those goals so I proposed a few tweaks. I proposed a name change to target those specific groups and also to

ensure this job is working specifically for this group. I really want to vote yes but I am not sure if I am ready to vote on this yet.

Jaedon: is the job based around volunteer opportunity and advocating for people with disabilities, is that the focus?

Christian: Yes, and to explain it more the first part was to support those that aren't heard, and the next point was the one service project a semester, the third part was working with student success other departments and getting those resources out. The last part was with disabilities making sure they are being heard.

Jaedon: I think this is a super cool position, but I do think that a lot of this job we as ASWU could already be doing it. I also feel like we could already put together an all ASWU outreach event and I don't think it would be too much for us to take on and I also think it's a lot of money that could be used for something else.

Hannah: I think that this position is a great thing because although we should already be doing these things in our job, we also have specific people such as cultural events that are reminding us to do these things and have specific programs. This is also covering the service projects that zone reps would have done normally.

Olivia: People were wondering that since reps are no longer doing service projects would they work with them

Faizzan: I agree I have worked with Katie and Landon, and I know there are lots of departments that may be short staffed and can't advertise or support enough. One thing I fear is that this position may not be provided the necessary information and with the service outreach project, but I think that is something that we should already be doing and that should be in our job descriptions. \$6,000 is also a lot of money but I would perhaps like to see how it goes.

Victoria: I am in extreme favor of this position. Flex was created as an outreach program for flex students and this position would be another outreach person for those that are unrepresented that would have all the information would be helpful.

Adaeze: what I'm hearing that the only downfall is that ASWU should be doing these and I don't think there is anything wrong with doing more than the bare minimum. To do more is never an issue and I think this position is something we should have even if it is \$6,000.

Georgia: Adaeze said a lot of the stuff I was going to say. Going back to the idea that we should do service projects, we have not been doing this at all. Also, that money is a lot but compared to other things it is not a lot and this position follows our mission statement.

Jed: going back to the service piece, I like the idea but would like to amend it I don't think it should be a part of this job since I want to focus this job to low income and disability. I propose a friendly amendment to delete section 8 from the job description

Georgia: I cannot accept that since I think it's very important, but I understand what you're saying.

Olivia: one thing I like about this position is that it gives a focus to one person to do it since other senators already have a lot of events and stuff to plan. As a senator we already deal with stuff that this position would deal and it would be good to have someone we can go to for information

Emma moves to extend by 5 mins, Jed seconds In favor 14 | Opposed 2 | Abstaining 2 Motion Passes

Katie luds: it sounds like there's a lot of consensus and what is it that people want changed?

Sam: I would say there are so many working parts to events and like Victoria said that having the flex-rep there to remind others that it needs to be catered to those they are representing. Having people there to remind those that plan to cater to those underrepresented population would be a great addition.

Faizzan: one thing that comes to mind is that I know through personal experience people don't know the resources they have and if this position could reach out to those that don't know what we have to offer. It would be amazing

if we could add that to the job description in having the coordinator talk to students

Emma: I have two questions; will the volunteer events go through programming and are there going to be events just helping the students or where they can gather?

Christian: when thinking of this position I wanted this to be in place so someone can be in a place where they can think of these things. I want that coordinator to know what the issues are on campus and address those things.

Jed: I've talked with Christian and I think I will bring up small changes such as the name which I think is too broad. Friendly amendment to change name to Accommodations coordinator

Jason: I think accommodations has legal power that we cannot have

Jed: I withdraw my amendment.

Parker: quick friendly amendment to remove coordinator meetings from the job description

Jed motions to table discussion In favor 3 | Opposed 14 | Abstaining 1

Approving proposal with friendly amendments In favor 15 | Opposed 2 | Abstaining 1 Motion Passes

Parker: We are going to be voting next week on the updates to coordinator job descriptions and we will be sending out those changes later this week to the assembly. Faizzan: we did approve one requisition for the incoming student paint night for

Jaedon: I think it is so expensive and idk if having money in our account gives us reason to just spend it

Olivia: I will say it is a lot and when I first looked at it I was not sure but I have been hearing a lot from people that there are not very many events where they can relax and destress since we don't have a spring break David: what happens with extra money?

Faizzan: it just rolls over and the accounts are filled up Jed: I don't see why we should be opposing it will be well organized with people who know what they're doing, and it is for students

Emily: a big thing about getting contracts is that it is expensive, but they do a lot of the work and is a great use of the unallocated for the students and we do have the money that doesn't roll over but gets refilled.

Jaedon: I misheard does it roll over or doesn't?

Hannah: whatever doesn't get used it stays there and only goes up to \$20k each year.

Jaedon: in the grand scheme you would still save the \$1500

Hannah: that would be using the ASWU fees that students pay for

Xavier: being a first year we kind of got screwed by a lot of things and with the amount of money we have left I think we could use it.

Hannah: unlike almost everyone in the room, they did not have a budget and so when talking about them this is something, we told them to requisition since they have no budget.

Emma: my only concern is with zoom; everyone has different schedules, and I don't know how many people will be able to attend and also, I am not sure if 50 kits is enough.

Olivia moves to approve, Jed seconds In favor 14 | Opposed 2 | Abstaining 2 Motion Passes

And if a student is running not in a hall and don't know anyone the current senator can put up posters for them class, bathrooms and non-academic buildings. Debates added it for future positions, so we do not lose it even if we do not have them this year, also about runoff elections.

Jed: is there info about negative campaigning, so I could talk about someone in the same office

Hannah: I would support it saying any candidate

Katie R: you might want to make a third option and talk about negative campaigning that it's not allowed – in the bylaws it was there before we removed it.

Jed: I'm all for banning negative campaigning but I do think if someone wants to say if someone acted not under whitworth values and if it's on record it could be used

Faizzan: more inclusive pronouns under active campaigning

Munya: it says 12 march for exec debates instead of April

Jed: can we add about something that we can use record-based actions

Olivia: Idk how I feel about that Jed since I don't know if I want people to go

Faizzan: I don't think it should be included because if someone is talking about behind your back, they might not be there to defend

Katie R: my thought is that if there is records of what people said about what they intend to vote, but in the minutes they don't write down what people vote yes or no

Jed: If someone is lying about someone's record than that is on them, and what happens in this chamber should affect how people vote and if a candidate says someone in this chamber does not represent whitworth or ASWU's vote then that should be able to use in campaigning.

Victoria motions to pass motion with Hannah's friendly amendments of the use of he/she/they pronouns, changing date to the 12th of April and adding stipulation about no negative campaigning In favor 17 | Opposed 0 | Abstaining 1 Motion Passes
