Guest Speaker

Breanna - We are excited to have Larry Probus with us here tonight. Larry is a great asset to our community.

Larry - I am excited to be here; I am over in McEachran Hall. He previously had a daughter Ellie here and James his son is a current student here at Whitworth. Larry knows Whitworth from a parent perspective. He was the chief officer at World Vision. He served for 13 years. Larry was brought here a couple years ago as a guest speaker. Ellie his daughter decided to come to Whitworth, and that is when he looked into careers on campus. Larry provides roles for finances and and wants to talk to the student here. Whitworth is a very well managed institution. There is a lot of desires to make changes to school, music building. This building will be open in a few weeks, and we are very excited about that. To students: Any questions you have?

Breanna - What are you most excited to work on for the year?

Larry - Most the campus. This is a beautiful campus, and renovating all of the buildings, and landscapes. The wind storm last year took out all of the trees and we now have a donor that will be providing funding for plants and trees and other landscape. He is really excited for what we can bring to the year.

Guest - What is the next big project that you are working on?

Larry - We are working on the pine bowl next once we get enough funds. Turf, stadium, building for training staff and players. Larry said we have some money from donors, just looking for more. They are also looking into a remodel and expansion of the Eric Johnson Science Building. There are also designs for a new dorm to replace the village. What else would you like to see?

Bailey - If there were more options for more upperclassmen to stay on campus (more like Boppell), that would be a great idea. Others would enjoy staying on campus with the feel of their own space.

Larry - Yes, that would be amazing, and great feedback. The drawings are done for the new dorms, currently priced at \$30 million, but we would need to have the support behind it.

Jordan - Going back to the pine bowl idea, we should look at adding lights, so that we can have night time games.

Larry - This is currently being looked into.

Norma - I would like to echo what Bailey said. This summer I worked for the Alumni Discovery Project, and the majority of the alums said that they would have liked to have dorms dedicated to upperclassmen with more privacy and space to cook for themselves.

Larry - Great feedback.

Rachel - It would be great for upperclassmen, especially guys since of girls only Boppell dorm, to provide more options to stay on campus.

Larry - I agree. Thank you for the idea.

Evan - Like the idea of renovating academic buildings.

Mae - I have heard a lot of feedback that buildings should be renovated.

Larry - The buildings have been renovated. He thinks that as an outsider coming in, academic buildings look older from the outside, but fairly nice inside. We have a lot of historic buildings

Christina - Older Buildings (Westminster and Johnson), don't have many windows or light and would be nice to see some changes within these buildings.

Larry - Makes sense

Michaela- Only two mac labs on campus, and with graphic design and other computer based majors, we need more options. Many classes are held in the two labs,

Breanna - This is just my dream, but after doing conferences and such, would be awesome to have another conference space. After certain times, there isn't a lot of options on campus for bigger events.

Larry - I have heard plans for a theater that is in the works. About the same size as Cowles. About 4 or 5 on the priority list right now.

Jeff - What is the effect of the budget allocation project and effect on students.

Larry - Whitworth is financially sound, and expenses are going up (4%) and revenue going down (6%). This task force was started about 6 months ago, to try to see what low priority items we can cut to help fund more popular or higher demand items. Conclusions are supposed to be presented in February 2017. They are looking at classes and services we offer. We are looking to reinvest and reallocate from one place to another. Whitworth is a head of the curve, about 2 to 3 years early. This is the right thing to do, and they are still looking into specifics.

Jeff - There is a way for student input?

Larry - Yes you can look on SharePoint, and submit your ideas or suggestions there for the committee to review.

Breanna - To do so, students can go onto Pirate Port and click the link on the right side, SharePoint and voice your opinion under budget allocation.
