

ASWU Meeting Minutes 10/12/2016

Meeting was brought to order at 5:01pm in the AWSU Assembly Chambers

- 1. Club Updates
- a. Westminster Round

First event they held was a game night. About 20 people showed up, which wasn't too bad. We played board games, and we also are having a Harvest Party on the October 21st. The English department always does a motto contest every year, and the winning design will be made into a t-shirt design. We will also be having a Christmas party and some collaboration with Off the Page club. The Harvest Party will be at 7pm on the 21st. They will be holding a poetry event sometime in mid November. They hold meetings every Monday at 11:30am.

2. Guest Speaker - Campus Security

Jacquelyn Christensen - I brought Mark along for the evening, one of our evening officers. I want to start off by opening it up to everyone for questions or suggestions you may have about security.

Mae - I live in Warren and when we have football games or other events at the pine bowl, the residents end up losing a lot of parking to non residents. Students don't mind when they have to park farther away when they lose their spots to residents but it is more frustrating when it goes to non-residents. Jacquelyn - It is hard to find parking during events with extra people on campus, I agree. We used to have students directing traffic, so maybe that is something we can look into doing again. We can also minimize traffic and parking by keeping events on separate days instead of doubling up.

Michaela - There is a pathway that extends from Oliver behind the village and goes between BJ and Stewart. There really isn't any lighting over there, is there something we can do about that?

Mark - I will put in a work order, great idea.

Christina - I have a suggestion from a friend that the main doors into the hub should have electronic locks, like all the academic buildings for safety reasons. Also the university should look into expanding the number of blue lights around campus. The needed areas are in between Duvall and Oliver and also in front of Ballard and McMillian.

Jacquelyn - We are trying to as a campus moving towards a one button campus lockdown. It just comes down to money, but we are on track and it is on our list to install all electronic door locks. The blue lights are a big expenditure, so that's why we haven't had any more installed. Additional blue light stations are also on the list to be added in the future. Did you guys hear the announcements during the storm? General assembly nodded yes.

Jacquelyn - I would suggest that you guys come up with a list as a group and email them to her or Chris in facilities and they will look at taking care of them.

Breanna - Can you speak to moving into student life and what that has been like?

Jacquelyn - We looked at other universities and it made sense logistically. We work together on a lot of things, and it helps with communication. A couple years ago we focused on efforts on "community policing", and being more available. We are not armed; we are more of an educational type program.

The security staff will be in the hub more as people from the community are trying to blend in and steal stuff, so I have asked my staff to increase their presence in this area.

Jeff - For the backpack issue, I've heard an idea of moving the scanning station forward?

Jacquelyn - I keep getting pushback, but if they heard the idea from students, they might listen to you. Rachel - I was here over the summer and twice I locked out and security officers that came to let me in, never checked for my ID. That seems problematic and a security concern?

Jacquelyn - Technically we are supposed to check for ID every single time. You would actually be surprised how many people actually have voiced frustration with having to show their ID's. Shaun - What is the main call you receive?

Mark - Lock outs. We have a set of keys for everything, so we are constantly called for access to buildings.

Jacquelyn - If you ever have an idea, please let her know. They are always looking for suggestions. Mark - Oh, one more thing, even if you are an off campus student, you have to a vehicle registration to park on campus. Its going to cost less money if you just get the pass, instead of paying for tickets. Mike - I'm wondering why the ticket for parking violation is \$60, and possession of marijuana is \$20? Jacquelyn - It's because two different officers decide the prices for those fines. Unfortunately, that is what has been decided.

3. Club Updates - Continued

a. Pep Band

Maddie - I am the President of the Pep Band, and if you were at the homecoming football game or parade, you heard the 7 of us playing. We are planning on playing at the rest of the football games as well as the basketball games this winter. We are very excited to be at more girls basketball games this year than in years past. 4. FVP

Jeff - We have a requisition from Outdoor Rec that you all should have received an email about. We have a couple individuals here from Outdoor Rec to help answer any questions and give us some information.

Tucker - We are looking for funding for rain gear. This fall we had our supplier drop our program, so we are in need of our own supply of rain gear. We are looking to rent these out to students, so they can stay warm. There is a lot of students who do not own this type of clothing, so for individuals to participate this would help a lot.

Tristan - For someone new to ASWU, is the purpose of the capital and unallocated accounts to spend it by the end of the school year, as it gets replenished every year by fees paid by the student body?

Jeff - Yes, with the expectation of we have to maintain a \$5,000 balance in capital for any emergency.

Breanna - Noticed you are looking at Black Diamond brand. Is there a reason why a higher priced brand was selected?

Tucker - We wanted quality, and want to keep it for years, so that's why is why it is more money. We weighed the price and quality before presenting and decided it was worth it to spend more money and have higher quality equipment.

Jordan - How many trips do you guys take that could use this equipment?

Tucker - About 50 trips per year, but especially during the winter this equipment is a necessity for many. Emily - Are people paying additional amount for the rental of the equipment, or is this rain gear included in registration fee?

Tucker - They are included for our trips, but we will do outside rentals for students who want to use it on their own time.

Jeff - Have you guys looked at purchasing gear from people in the community, second-hand?

Tucker - Yes, we will always accept second-hand gear that is in good shape. The problem right now is trip leaders are providing students with their own gear since we do not have a sufficient amount.

Breanna - Do you guys think that a sponsorship from a retailer would be an option you could look into?

Tucker - I'm not sure that would be an option for us. The ones that are the most durable in the requisition, we are already getting a discounted rate. The suppliers help us out with the gear service and repairs as well once we receive it. We have a good relationship with Black Diamond as well.

Jordan - Is the \$1,000 Outdoor Rec is contributing current money you guys have in your account, or anticipated profits from trip registration fees?

Tucker - This is money from our equipment budget.

• Outdoor Reps Step Out -

Jeff - Any questions before we vote? The finance committee recommended that we purchase 5 rain gear sets. The committee thoughts on this was that they could find used gear. The 5 sets would provide them a good start.

Jordan - My feeling is that in years past, they have always scraped it together. I would recommend that the money could be used elsewhere. I think they could charge more money for the trips for students who use this equipment for revenue.

Shaun - How much are they contributing out of their own budget?

Jeff - 1/3 - \$3,000 is their budget

Ivan - I was not very convinced during the finance meeting.

Christina - Being someone who doesn't want to bring all their clothes to Whitworth, I think it is definitely worth it. We have a lot of students from different parts of the world, who may not own this type of clothing and it would be good to provide them with an option.

Mae - I had a friend that had her personal jacket ripped when she let a student use it on a trip.

Rachel - I think if they are willing to contribute a 1/3 of their budget, that is a big portion which means they believe it is necessary.

Alexander - I recommend that they come up with this money out of their own account, instead of "charging" the whole student body for a smaller portion of students who participate.

Alex F. - Can you clarify the numbers?

Christina - This purchase would benefit the student body, as Whitworth is known for allowing its students to participate in all sorts of things.

Jordan - We should consider that the revenue ASWU will never see, that it will go to Outdoor Rec if they choose to charge more for the rentals.

Josh - I would like to motion to give them second 5 sets of rain gear in the amount of \$1,223.53. Alex F seconds, 13 for, 4 opposed. It passes.
