I think a lot of the students are starting to branch out a little bit but they have no idea what their options are. Like there are subs across the street there's smoothies across the street. just where everything is and what they can get, where. So if you guys wouldn't mind doing newsletters if you could post the link for us we're trying to get as many on there as we can. thank you. As well as where our menus are that would be really helpful too especially for the students that have dietary issues they could look up menus in advance and see what they can eat for breakfast, lunch and dinner and where everything is. And then moving forward we have stuff like this that you can put in your newsletter how do you guys want it? would it be easier if we sent you guys an e-mail with just information you guys could just kind of cut and paste?

BobbiJo: you can send it directly to me. I am BobbiJo. The only BobbiJo on campus. So just look me up and if you send it to me I can send it to all the senators.

Megan: Does anybody in here use mobile ordering? ohk OK. you'll have to try it out. you'll get loyalty points. which you'll get free stuff later on. So use the mobile app that is mobile ordering. You get to skip the line! which is nice. any questions while you have all of us here?

Sophie: I had someone reach out to ask if you guys have any new plans for vegan options. She kind of stated a little bit of frustration that she had a lot of rice, tofu and vegetables and that was a pretty consistent meal option and her only meal option. So just wanted to know when you guys are here that you might branch out a little bit or not and are able to offer more of those options.

Megan: Have her reach out to us directly and we should probably most the time we try to do a tour of the dining hall with those students that don't feel like they're finding enough options because there's so many options out there right like a vegan pizza right that's upon request. Healthy living is 99.9% of the time vegan and it's not just always tofu. Granted right there is tofu on that station. But there's a lot of you know chickpeas and lentils and high protein vegetables and jackfruit. Yeah or hearts of palm which are delicious but things like that too so she may not just be aware of all the options which is most of the time it's hard to know where they're every day. So we know what's available but hard to know kind of what to look for or what stations always have a vegan option.

Chet Hunt: Along those lines a lot of times we have vegan options that aren't out. We don't have enough people that want them so we don't just put them out so they sit there for hours. So when somebody comes in they ask us, we can run to the back real quick and make them most of the time but they would never know it's there unless they've been on the tour with us and we have informed them. It's really helpful to come in and do the walkthrough with us.

Niraj: and it's also like a lot of vegans that I know, they go to healthy living but you can go to the sandwich station and get everything but the meat option. Like mixing around, different combinations so yeah.

Megan: Thanks Niraj. That's why the tours are helpful. The deli also have a vegan option but we're not that good telling those stories sometimes. For lack of better communication right. It's hard to always communicate everything that's available. Any other questions? Did we answer your question? yeah OK perfect! So send them our way. It's helpful for us to know those students as well so that we can keep an eye out and help them. So yeah now you know we're here! Come to us with issues and send people our way. Thank you!
