Gwen: Any questions for Sarah? Next we have an update from UMOJA. Is Sophia or someone else from that club here? OK never mind then last update is the hidden opponent. Anyone from that club is here? OK great never mind then that's all from me.

Financial Director Update

Michael: so for context yesterday budget committee like interim budget committee met we discussed where we're gonna appropriate the rest of the like the funds like the rollover that we had we spent about two hours doing it yesterday it does however will need to be approved by assembly. so I'm going to go through right now everything that we approved yesterday. I don't have any questions before I start. OK so I'm just gonna focus on this section because this is like essentially how we like just decided to do the numbers because I didn't wanna go and change every individual account and try and keep track of everything because I didn't know what was going to get approved and what wasn't and so this obviously is subject to change again lots of discussion went into this last night, so I'm gonna start line by line made about \$50,000 of roll over that we wanted to like assign to various people instead of going through like every single club and guessing who needs how much money that's obviously very complicated there's tons of clubs. we just essentially decided to really full capital and unallocated as much as we can and that hopefully covers all those bases, so obviously those numbers there that's to get capital up to 30,000 and sorry unallocated up to 30,000 in capital up to 20 so then there's tons of money for students and clubs to then requisition for. I don't assume that we have any questions about that, then we decided to give you'll see there's two line items for international student center 1 is 5000 the second one was 2200 those are both for one new initiative and one old one, the first new initiative I guess if you want to ask further questions Niraj is sitting right there, first one is there's obviously a lot of students that can't go that don't necessarily have places to go home to for Thanksgiving and that Christmas breaks and other holidays on campus so originally niraj's idea was to kind of take a a pool of ASWU's money and then use that to help with like food insecurity during that time because hub isn't open not everyone has a home to go to, we then decided that we would then open that up to other students who also won't be able to go home so it's not just for international students however it is Niraj who's going to be like heading up that initiative so that's what's going into his budget that's the 5000 and the 2200 was for an initiative that was started last year called the Lulu Gonzalez travel fund which helps essentially international students get home and subsidise the cost of their flights as they are expensive, so those are here and here, do you have any questions about those? Nothing? Great, then the heat Chapel and then intramurals will be essentially just decided to assign just \$1000 for heat and Chapel and \$2000 for intramurals it's just because historically we have cut these programs quite significantly I've spoken to all the programs they have indicated that they are fine with the money they have but like everyone else agreed to a little bit more so this was just for us to support those programs where we can, questions about that? Disagreements? The only clubs that we like did discuss individually will increase on pep band just because their budget requests last year were incredibly large and especially the club increased so they obviously do a lot of good work for the community it's a great service projects for students on campus so we thought that we'd support them because they're doing a good thing for the community members of Spokane pep band also generally they submit quite a large budget request because they like to purchase instruments they don't just perform whitworth they perform at other schools and events we haven't had the money in the past to give them enough money to help support them in their purchasing of the instruments but we did have some extra obviously lying around so we decided to give that to them because in the last three years I think we've haven't been able to give them the money that they need, they also do get lots of donations so this is that

coupled up with their donations as well but yeah have any questions about that? then BMac this is I guess 500 to Mac and 500 to Ballard but I guess the budget kind of seems to melt into one these days um that's just cause a lot of people attend the BMac events historically. we probably need to reevaluate how much money Bmac gets. they're definitely probably the most attended like senator events I would argue and so this is to help with milk and cookies as they do every week other events they put on because they have like a lot more traditional events than other residence halls do. do you have any questions about that? Off campus senator again off campus centers has put on great events this semester we noticed the budget was getting low we decided to give her 1000 more Abi was going to recquisition anyway so it's decided to essentially cut that process short just give us some more money again we did cut the off campus senators budget I think by thousand last year because last year's senator didn't I guess use all the budget but it seems that Abi this year is putting on more events than last year senator and so we decided to up that budget by like 1000.

BobbiJo: Hot take. not more, just bigger events.

Michael: Okay I didn't even say it was you I just said last year's senator. And then this was actually my budget just because normally we don't have interim budget committee so all my budget essentially goes to providing food for those who are sitting in spring budget committee cause those meetings are very long and go on for days and so we have yesterday's meeting which obviously took like a chunk of our budget in terms of food so I was like I'll just fill up that budget committee has money for food next semester. Do you have any questions about that? Okay, how are we doing this next one are we gonna present position 1st and then do the budget? Ok I'm just gonna give a budget on the money so everyone can keep this in mind when Isaac and BobbiJo are presenting now essentially we're going to propose introducing a new position into ASWU. We're gonna call it I guess that we're running name is school spirit coordinator, we have had school spirit coordinator in the past, due to lack of need and budgeting we then you know got that position however we've come into a situation where the peers that there is a need for it we do have some money lying around so there's essentially like monetarily is kind of like an experimental period because we're essentially taking next semester to see if this is a position that warrants the money, warrants the need and then in spring budget committee we will determine whether or not we want to carry on that forward and whether not aswu can like afford to take on this position. Now I'm not going to go into detail about like what that does because we're gonna have a whole section dedicated to that in Isaac updates but this is just the budget so essentially I mean hourly position I think what we decide on 9 hours so they get around about I think like \$3000 for next semester and then the rest would be like they're working budget again they don't necessarily gonna use all of that but this is just up to the amount that we've approved kind of a second experimental amount. That takes us to essentially all the money that we want to approve. Do I have any questions, do I have any other suggestions do you have anyone who feels strongly that money should go you know one place and not another this is your time to speak.

Sophie: I know Avery had a question about like since all of this money is like leftover from the students why isn't it just being returned to the students or why aren't we like sending out like a survey or something to ask where they think it should go?

Michael: I mean I think that's a fair question. This is roll over that we have from previous years so it isn't necessarily just a student body that money's coming from and this is rollover I guess from last year. just last year Todd right yeah OK so just last year so I guess new freshman there's technically isn't your money like it is but it isn't and so we're not here to like you know it'd be like ohh every student you know I don't even know how much that would be divided back like this is just historically ASWU had rollover that kind of acts like a buffer so that if we go through periods of you know financial difficulty we can like rely on our rollover. The previous person the Jason's position however sorry not Jason's ..so essentially before I got into this position the budget wasn't necessarily run strictly and we got into a situation where we were like essentially going into the red every single year and then that obviously isn't fair to students who have been paying money and then essentially that like an incoming students have to pay the deficit from like previous years does that make sense and so between like todd and me and the finance committee, the budget committee obviously the last two or three years we've been very conservative with and prudent when it comes to like money or signing budget etcetera and so now we aren't in the red anymore which is great so they've been in the red for like the last 6-7 years something like that so we're out of it, we have never been in a position where we're like this time of year we just have this much money lying around so this is very new for us. if you're wondering why we didn't like individually survey every student like I guess we could do that but in fairness we are aswu and so in theory we do represent the student body and there is like a diverse group of people that are sitting on the budget committee that's why there's like restrictions and parameters for who can be on budget committee and who can't. I guess the idea is that the student bodies representative budget committee and that these decisions are then decided in budget committee and then we present them to the rest of the assembly everyone here is supposed to represent you know their constituency so in theory the whole student body and so I don't necessarily think there's a need for us to go in individually survey every single student to decide what how they think the money should go where they think it should go because everyone's can have an opinion. Is that clear? so do I hear no more questions about this. now this is technically where we're supposed to put it but I think we probably need to approve the position first before we approve this so I'm gonna just segue right off.

Isaac: Let's skip over to this real quick this is a position board drafted together as Michael said it's existed in the past but now that we have the extra rollover the need of that position is in the slightly different. Generally the school spirit coordinator is a 9 hour position that will be responsible for coordinating the mascot for the captain patches related activities so they'll be overseeing appearances logistics behind that as well as being part of that yeah connection with athletics as well but those are the high level things are there any questions?

BobbiJo: For everyone who wasn't here, my first year which was basically the first year we really had Patches. Patches used to be at evry event. Everyone loves patches and Todd has so much on his plate that we just can't like Jason used to run it don't know how many times but he did Todd does not have time for that so essentially this would be someone that making sure that patches at every appearance that he can be interacting with this working community he used to go to baseball games like the Indians used to go all sorts of places he used to go to the chiefs games like that kind of stuff so this essentially would be bringing back what patches was before he started dying. Anyone who done it last year they know he died okay. He has been dead this whole time. Reincarnation but essentially it would be resurrecting his presence any questions?
