- VI. Club Updates
  - a. Colleges Against Cancer Sarah Ozanne
    - i. Relay for Life is next Friday. There are about 25 teams. You can come even if you aren't on a team. There will be entertainment all night long. The movie this year is Heavyweights. Opening ceremony and dinner is at 6 and it will go until 8am. We will be raising money to send kids to camp for a week. Contact Sarah with questions.

    - i. We had a medical professional's panel which was very cool and helpful. I couldn't have expected anything better. We are making t-shirts to sell at Springfest. We will also be selling fried Oreos also.

    - i. We have monthly meetings, game nights, and sala lessons. We have bi weekly Spanish discussions. We will be joining the ballroom dance club for a program. There will be an alpaca ranch later this semester.
  - d. Political Awareness Club Tyler Whitney
    - i. We changed our name from Political Activism because we see ourselves as more of an informational club. We have had sporadic meetings this semester but they have moved more towards Thursday nights for dinner. We had Sam Harris on the phone. We are sponsoring Sam Reed coming to Relay for Life to talk about Civic engagement. We will be passing out buttons. We will not be requesting for as much money this year as last.
- VII. Alan Jacob Housing Update
  - a. In Duvall Hall next year first and fourth floor are guys only and second and third floors are girls only. Having mixed floors gets confusing. Schumacher- not going to be a dorm next year. Akili won't be used either. Tiki and Shalom will join Boppell and Stewart. Keola is getting leveled. People will still need to have their rooms be in the same condition that they were in when they check in because of asbestos. We will net 110 new beds. It is cost effective to consolidate the costs around campus. We will still have a high number of beds around campus for all the students. Akili and Schumacher could both be used again in the future as dorms. The Fungeon in Warren is going to be a men's hall. This addresses the trend of a closer equilibrium of male to female on campus. Students will participate in the in house process for their dorms for those living in Warren, Keola, and Schumacher. I am going to need the beds in Schumacher and Akili back in a few years.
  - b. East There are going to be 93 beds of 170 total beds in the housing lottery. There will be approximately 61 freshmen. This is the typical campus ratio for dorms with upperclassmen and freshmen. Almost all of the rooms for freshmen are doubles. We try not to put freshmen in singles. Do not go into the building yet because it is still owned by the construction company. Each floor has one or two study rooms. The toilets in the restrooms will be dual flush. We are hoping to certify it as Leid certified. There is a giant

refrigerator freezer in the lounge. There will be about 30-40 cupboards where students can keep cooking materials and lock them up. Student storage is very small in the building. In reality it is surplus so this is one area where we cut back a little bit. It is less than what is ideal but we are hoping to make it work. There will also be a music practice room. The walls are all double insulated which should cut down on noise problems.

- VIII. Chartering for W.I.S.E. (Women in Society Everywhere) Carissa Pawell
  - a. This club looks at teaching about gender equality. It used to be a club but it hasn't been on for the last year. Our advisor will be Pamela Parker. Both men and women can be in the club. We would like to put on an event for Barbie's 50<sup>th</sup> birthday. We would also like to introduce the campus to ecofeminism.

To the ASWU President and Assembly:

Christine DeHaven was an official candidate for the off campus senator position. She was a write-in candidate that submitted an application within 24 hours of the closing of the primary elections. I sent her an email requesting the information needed for the ballot (ID number, cell number, campaign blurb) on Sunday night, asking that it be turned in on Tuesday night at the latest. No final time was specified. I left my office at 9:15 last night. I neglected to check my email before the ballot went online this morning at 8 am. Unfortunately Christine had sent me that information at 9:40 pm. I received her email this afternoon after I had sifted through today's emails. She is not on the ballot, but should be. This mistake is my responsibility.

In my opinion, the Off Campus Senator election is invalid. Please consider this letter a grievance against this election process because of this mistake. Please review this information. My recommendation is that a re-election should take place. I have contacted the Student Elections Committee to get their feedback on a possible date/time should you call for a re-election (by a 2/3 vote). Please see Section IX of Article VII in the ASWU By-Laws (pg 75 of your training binder) to confirm this protocol.
