- Community Building Day

 - We are going to Catholic Charities Community Warehouse, we don’t know where it is or what we’re doing
 - Upcoming Tuesday, September 20
 - Senators, encouraged (by Eric and Meredith) to go with Leadership Teams but you can come with ASWU; you do have to go somewhere though

 - Brittany – is there a link to WhitNet as a whole or different parts? (we think yes) no complaints
 - Kara – you don't have to log into WhitNet if you link from PP
 - A lot of people agree about logging you in so you don't have to do it more than once
 - Jonny – until it's the norm and necessary, I won't use it, it seems irrelevant
 - Kelly – what if they made it the homepage? Instead of Whitworth.edu
 - Jessica – a lot of it has to do with that prospective students go to whitworth.edu; returning students don't need a separate page

 - Students who would use it definitely would appreciate it; but we want to move quickly for the weather; doesn't know that it would be fruitful
